## Risk Assessment Questionnaire

In Australia, between 14% and 29% of all cats are FIV positive (varies by state). There is no treatment or cure. Cats with FIV may develop Feline AIDS which is potentially a fatal disease. There is a vaccine available that can help prevent infection. If your cat is at risk, then please call us as soon as possible to discuss protection options.
